SUBJECT: Recreational Boating Portages at Dams on Water Trails in Wisconsin

SUMMARY:




Impoundments behind dams provide many recreational boating opportunities in Wisconsin. However, dams are a barrier to boaters, primarily canoeists and kayakers, who want to paddle along the streams in the state. Chapter NR 330, Administrative Rules provides a procedure to assess navigation near dams, identify navigation hazards and the need for a portage around a dam, and specify an appropriate portage route and required signage. After the rule was adopted, an assessment was done for many of the state's dams in the 1980s and orders were issued to dam owners.

With the growing popularity of paddle sports in the state, concern has been raised whether adequate portage routes are being maintained around dams on popular water trails in the state. Information will be provided on the commonly used water trails in the state, identifying dam locations, regulatory authority at those dams and previous portage assessments at those dams. There are current procedures being used to ensure that adequate portage routes are being maintained at state regulated dams. Contacts have been made with the federal agencies that regulate many of the dams on the water trails to establish procedures that will assure those dams also maintain adequate portage routes.
