

Conservation Congress Resolution

Wisconsin Bow Hunters throughout the entire state are being discriminated by not being allowed to bow hunt during the firearm deer season.

Many hunters feel threatened that they cannot hunt during the rut of the season, which allows for more buck activity especially during daylight hours. These state hunters hunt in other midwestern states resulting in lost revenues for the state of Wisconsin. Tourist dollars are also lost during this time frame.

At present, state law does not allow bow hunting during the firearm deer season. However, it is permitted during the muzzleloader season. Wisconsin law is not consistent with other midwestern states, which allow bow hunting, such as Michigan, Minnesota and Iowa.

Wisconsin should allow bow hunting during the firearm deer season while following all current regulations and restrictions during the firearm season.

Be it resolved, the Conservation Congress at its annual meeting in Marinette County on April 16th 2007, recommends that the Department of Natural Resources take action to correct this situation by introducing rule changes permitting bow hunting during the fire arm deer season.
