CONSERVATION CONGRESS RESOLUTION

TROUT MAGEMENT MUST ADHERE TO PROVEN PRACTIVES

THE PROBLEM: The Wolf River, in eastern Langlade County, had always been a favored attraction to trout fishermen from throughout the mid-west and vital to the local economy. But during the last half-dozen years the trout and fishermen have diminished. The river and its watershed are well protected due primarily to the tireless work of many dedecated conservationists who worked closely with prior fish managers to determine the most productive brown trout stocking practices. Those successful practices have been ignored.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, BY TNE CITIZENS ATTENDING THIS Conservation Congress Hearing, in Langlade County, that:

The stocking of Brown Trout in the Wolf River shall return to SPRING STOCKING, in April, of 15,000 fish 5 to 7 inches in length, with the cooperation of local sportsmen, distributed as evenly as possible from the seventeen access points used prior. Thus when the season opens fishermen will find browns and native brook trout and carry-overs from prior years throughout the thirty miles of river.
