Whereas, the science of preserving the herd at a healthy & stable number in each DMU is paramount.

Whereas, the size of the unit determines the amount of observation, and the amount of information that should be supplied by Wildlife Managers to the officials of the DNR in charge of the deer hunt

Whereas, the information gathered is very important in providing the best deer hunt for the licensed deer hunters of Wisconsin. As well as providing the best habitat for the health of the herd.

Whereas, The men, women and teenagers that hunt in Wisconsin deserve the best deer hunt possible.

Now therefore be it resolved at the April Conservation meetings that the Wisconsin Conservation Congress act as strongly as they possibly can to protect the DMUs as they now are.

Now, therefore be it further resolved, that the Congress send copies of this resolution to Wisconsin Legislators the Natural Resources Board and The Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources.
