SUMMARY:

The National Wild Turkey Federation is donating \$5320.00 to the Bureau of Wildlife Management to be used to develop suitable wild turkey nesting and brood rearing habitat on public and private lands in Langlade county.

This gift will help fund a project to convert 30 acres of fallow farm fields on DNR property that have been out of production for 10-20 years to more vigorous grass stands. In addition, this gift will help provide good foraging sites on both public and private lands that are capable of supporting turkey populations.
