

SUBJECT: LAND ACQUISITION – ICE AGE TRAIL– COLUMBIA COUNTY

FOR: DECEMBER 2008 BOARD MEETING

TO BE PRESENTED BY: Richard Steffes

SUMMARY: The Department has obtained an option to purchase 70.56 acres of land from the Maurice Murphy Estate for \$600,000 for the Ice Age Trail in Columbia County. The item is being submitted because the purchase price exceeds \$150,000.

The 70.56-acre Murphy Estate tract is located in the Town of West Point in Columbia County. The parcel is located about 20 miles northwest of the City of Madison and five miles northwest of City of Lodi in the hills and bluffs south of Lake Wisconsin. It is a combination of woodland and open meadows with scenic views. The property is adjacent to the Ice Age Park and Trail Foundation's (IAPTF) 60-acre Steenbock Prairie parcel that runs down to Lake Wisconsin close to the Merrimac Ferry. To the southeast, the Department owns other State Ice Age Trail Area properties, including recent acquisitions from Don Horton and Columbia County at Gibraltar Rock. It will provide a 0.5-mile segment of the Ice Age Trail to be constructed and, along with IAPTF's Steenbock Prairie parcel, provide a road-to-road connection between the Merrimac Ferry and Slack Road, leaving potentially only one private parcel between Merrimac Ferry and Gibraltar Rock. It will become one of the outstanding segments of the Ice Age Trail with a long-term goal of being able to hike from downtown Lodi to Devil's Lake State Park.

In 1987, the Wisconsin Legislature passed legislation that established the Ice Age State Scenic Trail as a state project and directed the Department to develop a trail to promote public awareness and appreciation of Wisconsin's glacial heritage, to preserve and protect significant glacial features and other natural and cultural features associated with the period of glaciation, and to provide a continuous off-road trail for recreational use. The Ice Age Trail is a cooperative project between the Department, the U.S. National Park Service, the Ice Age Park and Trail Foundation and its various volunteer groups around the state, and the counties through which the trail passes. The Ice Age Trail was designated a National Scenic Trail in 1980 by Congress. It is one of only eight national scenic trails in the United States and when completed, will run for over a thousand miles through much of Wisconsin. The trail route extends from Door County, south through the Kettle Moraine to Janesville, and then north through Devil's Lake State Park to northwestern Wisconsin.


Purchase of the 70.56-acre Murphy property will help complete a portion of the Ice Age Trail and will provide opportunities for public recreation while simultaneously protecting the natural and scenic character of the land within this corridor. Hunting on this property will be considered after Board adoption and Legislative review of the proposed Rule WM-04-08, revisions to NR 10 and NR 45 relating to hunting on state Ice Age Trail areas.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board approve the purchase of 70.56 acres of land for \$600,000 for Ice Age Trail in Columbia County.







Stewardship Land Access: This property will be open to the public for hiking, nature appreciation and cross-country skiing.

2. JUSTIFICATION:

The Department proposes to purchase the 70.56-acre Murphy Estate tract that is located in the Town of West Point in Columbia County for the Ice Age Trail project. The parcel falls within the proposed Ice Age Trail corridor and is located about 20 miles northwest of the City of Madison and five miles northwest of the City of Lodi in the hills and bluffs south of Lake Wisconsin. It is a combination of woodland and open



meadows with scenic views. The property is adjacent to the Ice Age Park and Trail Foundation's (IAPTF) 60-acre Steenbock Prairie parcel that runs down to Lake Wisconsin close to the Merrimac Ferry. To the southeast, the Department owns other state Ice Age Trail Area properties, including recent acquisitions from Don Horton and Columbia County at Gibraltar Rock. It will provide a 0.5-mile segment of the Ice Age Trail to be constructed and, along with IAPTF's Steenbock Prairie parcel, provide a road-to-road connection between the Merrimac Ferry and Slack Road, leaving potentially only one private parcel between Merrimac Ferry and Gibraltar Rock. It will become one of the outstanding segments of the Ice Age Trail and brings us one step closer to the goal of being able to hike from downtown Lodi to Devil's Lake State Park. Acquisition of the parcel will allow natural resource habitat management activities and also enhance public recreation opportunities by securing a needed corridor extension of the Ice Age Trail.

In 1987, the Wisconsin Legislature passed legislation that established the Ice Age State Scenic Trail as a state project and directed the Department to develop a trail to promote public awareness and appreciation of Wisconsin's glacial heritage, to preserve and protect significant glacial features and other natural and cultural features associated with the period of glaciation, and to provide a continuous off-road trail for recreational use. The Ice Age Trail is a cooperative project between the Department, the U.S. National Park Service, the Ice Age Park and Trail Foundation (collectively known as the Triad) and its various volunteer groups around the state, and the counties through which the trail passes. The Ice Age Trail was designated a National Scenic Trail by Congress in 1980. It is one of only eight national scenic trails in the United States and when completed, will run for over a thousand miles through much of Wisconsin. The trail route extends from Door County, south through the Kettle Moraine to Janesville, and then north through Devil's Lake State Park to northwestern Wisconsin.

The trail provides opportunities to observe a large number of landforms that are unique to continental glaciation such as eskers, kames, drumlins and kettles, as well as many other features and places of natural beauty. The trail is intended for low impact uses such as hiking, backpacking, snowshoeing, and in suitable areas, cross-country skiing. To date, about half of the trail has been completed in numerous segments. Management, development and maintenance of the trail will be shared between the Department and the Ice Age Park and Trail Foundation. The Natural Resources Board approved a Triad-developed "Corridor of Opportunity" for the Ice Age Trail through southern Columbia County in 2000. At its March 2004 meeting, the Natural Resources Board approved implementation steps of the Land Legacy Plan, placing a high priority on Ice Age Trail land acquisition.

Purchase of the 70.56-acre Murphy property is recommended to provide for the establishment and maintenance of a portion of the Ice Age Trail and provide opportunities for public recreation while simultaneously protecting the natural and scenic character of the land within this corridor. Hunting on this property will be considered after Board adoption and Legislative review of the proposed Rule WM-04-08, revisions to NR 10 and NR 45 relating to hunting on state Ice Age Trail areas.




Comment: A second appraisal report was done by Robert Richardson. He estimated value at \$670,000. The Stone report was considered the better indicator of value.



Ice Age Trail Corridor




Project Boundary
