

Retirement Resolution

Deborah Henke, Financial Specialist, Kettle Moraine State Forest -- Southern Unit, retired from the Department of Natural Resources on March 14, 2008, after 18 years of dedicated service to the State of Wisconsin. Debbie worked her entire career in the Parks and Recreation Program at the Southern Unit in Eagle.

A native of Oregon, Wisconsin, Debbie earned an Associate Degree in Liberal Studies from the University of Wisconsin -- Stevens Point. She graduated from the Madison Area Technical College with an Occupational Health Assistant diploma and worked as an Occupational Therapy Assistant for four years at St. Mary's Hospital in Madison. She returned to Madison Area Technical College as an instructor in the Occupational Health Assistant Program.

In April 1990, Debbie began her career at the Kettle Moraine State Forest - Southern Unit as a Clerical Helper. For 11 years she worked at the Southern Unit in a variety of customer service positions. In May 2001, she was appointed to the Southern Unit's Financial Specialist Position.

Throughout her career, Debbie used skills and knowledge to assist co-workers in resolving problem situations. Debbie excelled in meeting and exceeding customer service expectations at the Southern Unit, one of the most diverse properties in the State. Her experience and understanding of campground reservation procedures allowed her to assist the Parks and Recreation Program transition to a statewide automated computer reservation system. Debbie played a vital role in hiring and training seasonal staff at the Southern Unit. She developed training procedures to ensure that staff provided quality customer service. She served as a positive role model and mentor for staff.
