

**SUBJECT: LAND ACQUISITION & DONATION – STATEWIDE FISHERIES HABITAT PROGRAM –
BROWN COUNTY**

FOR: JUNE 2008 BOARD MEETING

TO BE PRESENTED BY: Richard Steffes

SUMMARY: The Department proposes to purchase the 10.88-acre Rosnow parcel for the Statewide Fisheries Habitat Program. The parcel is located along the banks of the Suamico River in northern Brown County approximately one mile upstream of the mouth of the river into Green Bay. The purchase price is \$32,000 or 19% higher than the Department’s appraised value of \$27,000. Three local sport-fishing groups are donating a total of \$4,750 to lessen the difference between the purchase price and the appraised value. The following funding commitments were made: Green Bay Area Great Lakes Sport Fishermen for \$750, Marinette Menominee Chapter of the Great Lakes Sport Fishermen for \$1,000 and the Brown County Conservation Alliance for \$3,000. The Department will pay the remaining balance of \$27,250.

The focus of the Statewide Habitat Program is to protect critical fishery habitat that is in danger of being destroyed through incompatible land use. The water resource targeted for protection contains habitat such as spawning areas critical to fish species intended for management. The parcel will help maintain production of important fish species through protection of lands encompassing the critical habitat as well as safeguard critical habitat from destruction from incompatible land use, such as risk of erosion or non-point source pollution.

The Rosnow property is primarily lowland hardwoods, brush, and a pond, which historically was used to capture carp moving upstream to spawn and collect them for markets. Later, the collection of minnows for bait replaced the carp operation. Remnants of a concrete water control structure remain on the property that redirected the flow of the river into a “carp pond” collection area. If approved for purchase, the control structure will be removed, the channel restored to provide improved habitat for spawning perch, northern pike, bass and pan fish. Additionally, a new water control structure will provide better water management in the ponds in addition to establishing rock spawning reefs and vegetation.


The Department recommends the purchase of the 10.88-acre Rosnow tract, taking this opportunity to partner with other conservation organizations to allow fishery habitat management, to provide public access for recreation, to consolidate public lands and to protect and enhance the fishery resource.





Location: The tract is located in the Town of Suamico along the banks of Suamico River in northern Brown County. The City of Green Bay is located five miles to the south of the parcel.

Land Description: The subject area is fairly level and covered lowland brush and woods.

Water: The subject has 1,595 feet of meandered frontage along the northern bank of the Suamico River and frontage along a 2-acre pond.

2. JUSTIFICATION:

The Department proposes to purchase the 10.88-acre Rosnow parcel for the Statewide Fisheries Habitat program. The parcel is located along the northern bank of the Suamico River in northern Brown County approximately one mile upstream of the mouth of the river into Green Bay. The purchase price is \$32,000 or 19 percent higher than the Department's appraised value of \$27,000. Three local sport-fishing groups

are donating a total of \$4,750 to lessen the difference between the purchase price and the appraised value. The following funding commitments were made: Green Bay Area Great Lakes Sport Fishermen for \$750, Marinette Menominee Chapter of the Great Lakes Sport Fishermen for \$1,000, and the Brown County Conservation Alliance for \$3,000. The Department will pay the remaining balance of \$27,250.

A new water control structure will provide better water management in the ponds in addition to establishing rock spawning reefs and vegetation. The Rosnow 10.88-acre tract borders a residential area to the south. Access to the parcel is gained from the east off County Highway J. There is no access except via water to the western carp pond.

The Department recommends the purchase of the 10.88-acre Rosnow tract, taking this opportunity to partner with other conservation organizations to allow fishery habitat management, to provide public access for recreation, to consolidate public lands and to protect and enhance the fishery resource.

3. FINANCING:

The following funding commitments were made: Green Bay Area Great Lakes Sport Fishermen for \$750, Marinette Menominee Chapter of the Great Lakes Sport Fishermen for \$1,000, and the Brown County Conservation Alliance for \$3,000. The Department will pay the remaining balance of \$27,250 with Stewardship funds.


Rosnow Property

T 25N R 20E Section 14 & 23, Town of Suamico, Brown County





-  DNR Eased Land






Rosnow Property
