

SUBJECT: LAND DONATION - CHIPPEWA MORAINES STATE RECREATION AREA- CHIPPEWA COUNTY

FOR: SEPTEMBER 2008 BOARD MEETING

SUMMARY: Mr. Rodney Cole has offered to donate to the Department 1.01 acres of land for the Chippewa Moraine State Recreation Area in Chippewa County. The property is the abandoned right-of-way for 250th Avenue, formerly called Eagle Lane, which creates a border between the towns of Bloomer and Sampson. Both municipalities have filed appropriate abandonment proceedings and title to the road right-of-way reverts to the contiguous owners, the Department and Mr. Cole.

In the Master Plan of the Chippewa Moraine, planners recommended closing some dead-end roads such as Eagle Lane or other roads, which no longer serve private lands within the recreation area. Road closures will minimize problematic illegal dumping, after-hour fires, camping, and vehicular damage to geological features adjacent to this narrow road. Once closed, the area will still allow foot traffic and will accommodate several parked cars.

Chippewa Moraine State Recreation Area is located in west-central Wisconsin about 20 miles north of the Eau Claire/Chippewa Falls area. The project, a cooperative venture with the National Park Service, was established in 1974 as one of the nine units of the Ice Age National Scientific Reserve, to protect the unique glacial features of the Wisconsin Ice Age. The recreation area consists of a large area along the terminal moraine known as the Chippewa Moraine and contains numerous kettle lakes and ponds. The area is managed to protect the scenic resources and geological values of the Chippewa Moraine area and for a variety of recreational, educational, and scientific purposes. The property is used for picnicking, hiking, nature and geological studies, Ice Age Trail-based recreation, cross-country skiing, and other outdoor recreational activities.


After road abandonment, the Department will gate off the old road and have a small parking area near the gate for three or four cars.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board accept the donation of 1.01 acres of land for the Chippewa Moraine State Recreation Area program, that a certificate of appreciation be sent to the donor and that an expression of appreciation be made a part of the official records of the Natural Resources Board.






