

Retirement Resolution

Patrick M. Rominski, Wildlife Technician-Advanced at Merrill, retired from the Department of Natural Resources on December 30, 2009 with more than 33 years of dedicated service to the State of Wisconsin.

Pat began his career with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources in April, 1976 as a seasonal Natural Resource Assistant for the Wildlife Management program in Merrill. He secured a permanent position in July, 1977 and worked in Merrill for his entire career. His position was reclassified several times and was eventually described as Wildlife Technician in 1992.

Throughout his career, Pat has a strong outdoor ethic. His work was guided by a need to protect wildlife resources and serve the hunting public. Pat was an advocate for the management of forest wildlife habitat on the Lincoln County Forest. He also worked diligently to train and support big game registrations stations, so that they could gather information necessary for wildlife management and also answer hunters' questions about regulations, seasons and management programs.

WHEREAS, Patrick Rominski has served the people of the State of Wisconsin faithfully and well in the performance of duties and has thus earned the commendation due an exemplary public employee;
