RESOLUTION FOR WISCONSIN DNR EXPERTS MANDATORY INDEPENDENT
PEER-SCIENTIFIC REVIEW INPUT REQUIRED FOR ANY LEGISLATIVE
ACTION BY WISCONSIN STATE CONGRESSIONAL LEGISLATORS

Recently, the Wisconsin State Legislation has passed bills without advice or due consideration from known experts in the DNR pertinent to that field of study. Expert advice, has been prohibited, in the interests of special-interest groups / politicians pushing specific agendas, leading to such extremes of appointing expensive out-of-state "consultants" (i.e. Deer-Czar) to tell us how to manage our resources.

DNR management, controversial due to political appointees, not necessarily experts, making legislative decisions, implementing policies that have questionable scientific legitimacy, that are subject to change depending on political whims (who's in office). DNR experts are forced to comply afterwards (with fear of reprisal) with questionable management polices and legal contradictions based on imposed political views. As a result of not allowing scientists to make decisions based on scientific evidence, policies are subject to change, jeopardizing the management of our natural resources (i.e. deer harvesting).

PROPOSAL: It is to be mandated that those policy changes being proposed for implementation or legislative decision-making require **independent peer-reviewed scientific published research** as input recommendations first from those experts in that specific field of study.
