



- ❖ **N. Settlement Road** (North of County Road "O") near Millston
- ❖ **Hwy 54**, seven miles East of Black River Falls
- ❖ **E. 7th Street**, off Hwy 12 East, near Black River Falls

Parking lots for the state forest trail system are plowed after each snowfall and trail maps are available at parking lot facilities. Parking lots and trail access points are located on:

Trail Access

Black River State Forest offers 51 miles of snowmobile trails, which link with 100 miles of Jackson County Forestry and Parks trail system. Snowmobilers can travel on state forest trails between Millston and Lake Arbuthus and between Black River Falls and City Point. Depending on weather conditions, trails are open from December 15 through March 15.

Snowmobiling



- ❖ To use the trail system, you must possess a current snowmobile registration. Please note that snowmobiling is allowed only on trails designated by orange blazers. Trails may also be closed periodically due to weather conditions.
- ❖ Beginning Jan 1, 2001, any person who is born after 1/1/85 and who has reached the age of 12, must have completed and received a snowmobile safety certificate in order to operate a snowmobile in Wisconsin. The certificate must be carried while operating the snowmobile, and displayed to a law enforcement officer upon request. Other states and provinces that issue a snowmobile safety certificate honored in Wisconsin.
- ❖ Children under the age of 12 who are operating a snowmobile must be accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person over the age of 18. Snowmobile riders between 12 and 18 years of age must have a valid snowmobile safety certificate, or be accompanied either by a person 18 years or older or

Rules and Safety

- ❖ All snowmobiles manufactured after July 1, 1975 must comply with a 78 decibel noise limit. A 55 mph night time speed limit applies from ½ hour after sunset to ½ hour before sunrise.
- ❖ A person 14 years or older who has a snowmobile safety certificate. Accompanied means to be on the same snowmobile as the operator. See the Wisconsin Snowmobile Laws Booklet for more information (PUB-LE-201 2004).
- ❖ Children under the age of 12 who are operating a snowmobile must be accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person over the age of 18. Snowmobile riders between 12 and 18 years of age must have a valid snowmobile safety certificate, or be accompanied either by a person 18 years or older or

Snowmobile Trail Pass

Wisconsin law requires those who use Wisconsin snowmobile trails to display either Wisconsin registration or a snowmobile trail pass. The trail pass can be purchased online at www.snowmobile.gov, over the counter at any DNR authorized license agent or by phone at 1-877-945-4236. The \$18.00 non-resident snowmobile trail pass is valid from July 1st through June 30th.

Emergency Trail Signage

Jackson County and Black River State Forest have an emergency trail signage system. Blue posts with red numbers are located along the trail in the event that an accident would occur along the trail. The top number on the post corresponds to the trail segment you are on, and the bottom number is the mileage marker. Give the top number first, then the bottom number when calling 911.





Black River State Forest Snowmobile Trails
