**2006-2007 Snowmobile Program Report
Summary**

The 2006-2007 Snowmobile Program Report was compiled from the 26 fatal investigations and other data collected during the fiscal year 2006-2007 (a fiscal year runs from July 1 – June 30).

Conservation Wardens investigate all fatal snowmobile incidents and as such, Wisconsin law requires that a conservation warden or law enforcement officer be notified immediately of any snowmobile incident that results in an injury requiring medical treatment by a physician. In addition, the operator(s) involved in these reportable incidents must file a written report with the Department of Natural Resources within 10 days, in so far as they are capable of doing so.

FATAL INCIDENT CAUSES

The primary type of crash causing the victim's death continues to be striking a fixed object such as trees, shorelines, or ice/rock. The secondary type of crash leading to the victim's death this reporting period is collision with a vehicle, followed by being struck by another snowmobile. The leading contributing factors were alcohol and excessive speed.

There were 19 (25 the previous year) fatal crashes that investigators directly identified speed as a contributing factor to the death of the operator/passenger. Of the 19 speed related fatalities, 12 of those that died had consumed alcohol or 46% (80% the previous year) of the speed related victims.

Alcohol was identified as another major contributing factor. The 2003-04 laws expressly stated a person is under the influence of alcohol once their blood alcohol level reaches 0.08; however, for the purposes of this report, any alcohol level identified in the coroner's report (by percent) is considered to be a contributing factor.

Fifty-four percent (26 of the victims) of the known toxicology reports performed show alcohol was consumed by the victim. Toxicology examinations were not performed on three victims; nine victims had no alcohol present. A review of the alcohol involved fatalities show that no victims had less than 0.013 alcohol levels. Twelve percent of the victims that consumed alcohol showed levels less than .08%. Nineteen percent of the victims that consumed alcohol had levels from 0.08 to 0.199%. Fifteen percent of the alcohol related victims were reported at 0.20 or above, with one victim result at 0.254.

WHO WAS INVOLVED

Twenty of the 26 victims were male. Victim ages ranged from 9-66 years, with the average age 37.8 years old; last season's average age was 36.2 years. The largest percentage of victims was age 30-39 years with 31%. The second largest age group was tied between 21-29 and 40-49 years of age, both with 19%. One child under 16 was killed this reporting period. Of the 26 fatal incidents, 20 of the victims were Wisconsin residents while 2 were from Iowa, 2 from Illinois, and 2 from Minnesota. The majority of the victims (22) had not received Wisconsin Snowmobile Safety Training. Of the 26 victims, 24 were known to have been wearing a helmet, 2 were not wearing a helmet.


WHEN DO THE INCIDENTS OCCUR

The highest percentage of fatalities was tied between Thurs. and Fri., both with six, Sat. and Sun. with five, Tues. with four, Wed. with two, and Mon. with one. Most of the fatal crashes (18) occurred between 12:01PM – 12:00AM.


LOCATION OF INCIDENTS

The top location of fatal incidents was on the trails with fourteen victims and tied between public roads and lakes/streams involving five victims each.

Percent of Victims Killed Showing Alcohol as a Contributing Factor




History of Snowmobile Fatalities




The 12-year fatal average is 27.6 deaths per year.

Snowmobile Fatality Rate to Number of Snowmobiles Registered





Fatals per 100,000 Registrations.




History of Newly Recruited Snowmobile Education Instructors

The total number of active instructors for 2005-2006 was 1,080.




History of Active Snowmobile Instructors

Over 259,386 students have been certified by volunteer instructors.




History of Certified Snowmobile Students

2006-2007, the average blood alcohol level for all victims was 0.152.




The 2006-2007 season showed that alcohol was a contributing factor in 54% of all fatalities.


2006-2007 Age of Snowmobile Fatality Victims

Twenty-three of the 26 victims were male.


The average age for the victims killed was 37.8 years old as compared to 36.2 years in 2005-2006.



2006-2007 Snowmobile Fatal Incidents by Day of Week




2006-2007 Snowmobile Fatal Incident by Time of Day








2006-2007 Snowmobile Engine Displacement for Machines Involved in Fatal Snowmobile Incidents



2006-2007 Fatal Snowmobile Incidents Speed and Location at Time of Incident




2006-2007 Fatal Snowmobile Incidents Type

2006-2007 Studded Snowmobile Track


Fatality Victim's Use
