


# Recycle - It's Easy

You can recycle by following these simple directions.


## Mixed paper and newspaper




- Bundle and tie newspaper



- Put mixed paper in large grocery bags




## Corrugated cardboard




- Look for the ribbed, wavy layer.



- Flatten the cardboard




- Bundle, bag or box it




## Plastic containers



- Collect by recycling code




- Remove caps and rings
- Rinse



- Flatten



- Bag or box it

- Paperboard (cereal boxes, paper egg cartons, paper towel rolls, etc.)
- Mixed Paper (junk mail, office type paper)
- Newspapers, Magazines & Catalogs
- Phone Books

- HDPE #2 Plastic Bottles & Jars
- #2 Tubs and Containers
- #3 - #7 Bottles and Containers



# Recycle - It's Easy

## Glass bottles and jars



- Remove the caps

- Rinse

No need to remove labels



- Separate colors (if required)



Clear



Brown



Green



No lightbulbs



No windows



No dishes or glasses


- Put in bags, boxes or buckets



## Aluminum



Aluminum cans



Foil



Pie plates



Magnets won't attract aluminum


- Rinse




- Flatten (if required)



- Bag or box it




## Tin cans




- Rinse




- Remove the label (if required)



- Open both ends and flatten (if required)



- Bag or box it
