5. Public Participation

• AWSC (Dave Newman)

- o In spite of most AWSC events and meetings being cancelled, the AWSC Office is open and processing memberships and selling trail passes.
- o AWSC will be proceeding with our Legislative agenda and have begun conversations with key Legislators.
 - 1. Eliminate the 40 foot rule
 - 2. Stationary sound test change to replace the 2004 version of the SAE J2567 test with the 2015 version
 - 3. Improve the language for dimming of lights when meeting other vehicles
- o We will continue to work with our clubs to maintain the access we have and should have.
- o Dave will be representing AWSC on the Deer Hunting Stakeholder Group.

Tourism Report (Drew Nussbaum)

- Wisconsin Department of Tourism is currently administering the TRAVEL Stimulus Grant that will help the Tourism Promotion and Tourism Development organizations in our state. This includes Chambers of Commerce, CVB's, and similar tourism entities. The WDT is also assisting with sharing information about the DOA Cultural Grant.
- Travel Wisconsin will launch the Winter Trail Conditions Report in November, and a thank you and reminder was presented for current snowmobiling conditions reporters to please continue to support the updates.

- The GIS data submitted by the counties identifies 700 miles of road routes. Uncertain how
 much of that is in between funded trail segment and how much is in club trail segments. If the
 40' rule is eliminated, some portion of that will likely become fundable trail.
- The statewide average paid out for maintenance is \$432/mile after taking supplemental requests into consideration.

• LAW ENFORCEMENT REPORT

- The Recreation Warden Team is comprised of 10 wardens (2 stationed in each region) who specialize in recreational vehicle crash investigation, specialized recreational vehicle enforcement, and off-highway vehicle training operations for conservation wardens. This team continues to provide great service to the citizens of Wisconsin.
- o In an attempt to expand safety messaging, the Department purchased a digital message board, similar to those orange message boards used in construction zones. This will allow wardens to post safety messages in real time at trail heads and other high use areas in an attempt to reduce crashes and to provide for over-all safe snowmobile operation.
- o From July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020, the Department through its dedicated volunteer safety corps certified approximately 10,592 students in snowmobile safety certification.
 - 4,322 students certified in person.
 - 6,270 students certified by online program.
- o From December 1, 2019 through April 30, 2020 wardens conducted approximately 12,000 hours for snowmobile patrol for snowmobile safety and enforcement.
 - During those patrols, wardens contacted approximately 13,400 persons
 - Wardens also provided assistance for approximately 2,000 calls for service that did not involve a violation.
- o From Jan 1st, 2020, Warden's and their partner law enforcement agencies to date investigated 19 fatal snowmobile incidents.
 - 12 of those fatal incidents involved alcohol, with an average level of .16 at twice the legal limit.
 - 12 of those incidents occurred on public trails.
 - 5 of those incidents occurred on frozen water
 - And 2 on the highway resulting from collision with a motor vehicle.

New Mile Discussion

- When the 40' rule goes away, some previously-considered-routes within a funded trail system will become eligible for funding as trails. Keep that potential fiscal draw in mind when approving new miles. Counties will need to apply for funding of those newly eligible segments, increased funding will not be automatic.
- Letter from Nancy Olson with concerns about the New Mile Scoring system. Discussion among Council that a lot of effort went into the ranking and it appears to be fair and balanced. More miles were awarded in the south of the state than the north last year.
- Project NM-66 was pulled from consideration as application is incomplete.
