Grant of Loan Program	Who Awards	Application Deadline
Wisconsin Assessment Monies- for local governments and private parties for Phase I and Phase II assessment and limited site investigations at closed and closing manufacturing sites	WI Dept. of Natural Resources	No deadline, continuous applications
Ready for Reuse Grants & Loans- for local governments, grants & 0% loans for up to 23 years for cleanup of petroleum and hazardous substances. Some federal requirements apply.	WI Dept. of Natural Resources	No deadline, continuous applications
Brownfields Grants - for local governments ¹ and private parties for brownfield cleanup and redevelopment.	WI Economic Development Corporation	No deadline, continuous applications
Brownfields Site Assessment- for local governments to perform environmental investigations; demolition of structures; and removal of abandoned containers and underground storage tank systems.	WI Economic Development Corporation	No deadline, continuous applications
TEA Grants (Transportation Economic Assistance) - for public or private entities with road, rail, harbor & airport projects that promote development and attract and retain businesses.	WI Dept. of Transportation	No deadline, continuous applications
EPA Brownfield Assessment Grants- for local governments to inventory and assess brownfield areas for contamination from petroleum & hazardous substances. No cost share.	US Environmental Protection Agency	Usually due in mid-November
EPA Brownfield Cleanup Grants- for local governments to clean up specific brownfield properties with contamination from petroleum & hazardous substances. Requires a 20% cost share.	US Environmental Protection Agency	Usually due in mid-November
EPA Brownfield Revolving Loan Fund grants- for local governments to establish a loan & sub-grant program for cleanup of petroleum & hazardous substances. Requires a 20% cost share.	US Environmental Protection Agency	Usually due in mid-November
Coastal Management Grants- for all counties adjacent to Lakes Superior and Michigan, may be used for planning, acquisition, restoration, non-point pollution control, public access & education.	WI Dept. of Administration	Usually due in early November
CDBG Community Development- several different sub-programs available to non-entitlement communities to assist in several types of projects in low- to moderate-income areas	WI Dept. of Administration	Varies (some annual, some continuous)
Stewardship Grants- for local governments & non-profit groups, can be applied at brownfield sites for development of parks, urban river projects and urban green space projects.	WI Dept. of Natural Resources	May 1 (Annually)

¹ In many cases "local governments" includes tribes as well as redevelopment, community development & housing authorities.
