




**WISCONSIN DNR

LONG LAKE, BAYFIELD COUNTY, 2011**

The Department of Natural Resources conducted a fisheries assessment of Long Lake, Bayfield County, from April 13, 2011 to April 20, 2011.


Long Lake is a seepage lake in the Superior basin. The walleye fisheries is supported primarily through stocking. The walleye population estimate is lower than lakes with similar characteristics.





Other Species

Some of the other species observed during this sampling but not included in this report were black crappie, blue gills, pumpkinseed, rock bass, yellow perch, and white sucker.

We are also conducting a creel (angler harvest) survey on Long Lake this year. Creel clerk Harry Johns will count and interview anglers and examine their catch throughout the fishing season.

Walleye	May 07-March 04	2	15" MINIMUM
Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass	June 18-March 04	5	14" MINIMUM
Muskellunge	May 28-November 30	1	34" MINIMUM
Northern Pike	May 07-March 04	5	NO MINIMUM
