




**WISCONSIN DNR
FISHERIES INFORMATION SHEET
WHITEFISH LAKE, DOUGLAS COUNTY, 2014**

The WDNR surveyed Whitefish Lake, Douglas County from May 6th through May 9th, 2014 to evaluate the walleye population. Whitefish Lake is an 831 acre seepage lake and has a maximum depth of 102 feet. The fishery includes panfish, northern pike, largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, cisco, brown trout, and walleye.

We are also conducting a creel (angler harvest) survey on Whitefish Lake this year. Creel clerk Marty Kangas will count and interview anglers and examine their catch throughout the fishing season.

General Fishing Regulations for Whitefish Lake, Douglas County, 2014

FISH SPECIES	OPEN SEASON	DAILY LIMIT	MINIMUM LENGTH
Walleye	May 03-March 01	3	15" MINIMUM
Largemouth Bass	May 03-March 01	5*	14" MINIMUM
Smallmouth Bass	June 21-March 01	5*	14" MINIMUM
Muskellunge	May 24-November 30	1	40" MINIMUM
Northern Pike	May 03-March 01	5	NO MINIMUM

*During harvest season for each species; you are allowed a daily bag limit of five largemouth or smallmouth bass in total.

This report is interim only; data and findings should not be considered final. Results of creel surveys should be available by June of the year following the survey.
