Limited distribution with little economic value, worthwhile to restrict sales. 3 - Not commercially grown, very invasive in Michigan. 4 - Too wodespread to prohibit, DNR used to sell this species in their wildlife packets. 7 - The DNR used to sell a USDA released cultivars, Cardinal and Red Wing, which are still available if you are a legitimate nursery, and it is still promoted to hunters as a habitat species. Ted Nugent Loves It! It is important to educate about the similarities with native species. 8 - Autumn olive spineless cultivar has reverted back to the naturalized plants that bear 1"-2" sharp thorns making removal even more unpleasant. 9 - Banned or prohibited in 4 eastern states.
