


Good Neighbor Authority Sale Area Map

Stip Clear Cut(15 Acres): 60' wide CUT and RESERVE strips will be established with contractor at pre-sale meeting. Within CUT strips, cut all stems 2" in diameter and larger. In addition, harvest all aspen and balsam fir with 3 or more pulp sticks

Shelterwood (99 Acres): Cut all trees 2" in diameter and larger EXCEPT Spruce, Tamarack, Cedar, Pine, Oak, Yellow Birch, Hemlock and any trees marked in ORANGE paint. In addition, do not cut ASPEN in stands bolded on map. All stands shall be cut in NON FROZEN conditions EXCEPT those bolded on map.

Select Cut Area(93 Acres): Cut all Aspen, 3 stick or more Balsam Fir, and any tree marked in BLUE paint.

- Pine and spruce volume contains pulp and sawlog volumes, but will be sold and scaled as cordwood.
 - Cordwood volume contains approximately 1MBF Spruce and 30 MBF White Pine
 - MX Volume is approximately 80% Red Maple, 15% Hard Maple, and 5% other hardwood species for both CDS and MBF

Minimum Acceptable Bid: \$74,046.80

Harvest Requirements:

Strip Clearcut (15 Acres): 60' wide CUT and RESERVE strips will be established with contractor at pre-sale meeting. Within CUT strips, cut all stems 2" in diameter and larger. Do not harvest any trees within the reserve strips. Slash must be kept less than or equal to 24" throughout stand.

Shelterwood 1 (61 Acres): Cut all trees 2" in diameter and larger EXCEPT Spruce, Tamarack, Cedar, Pine, Oak, Yellow Birch, Hemlock and any trees marked in ORANGE paint. Must be cut in NON-FROZEN conditions. Slash must be kept less than or equal to 24" throughout stand.

Shelterwood 2 (38 Acres): Cut all trees 2" in diameter and larger EXCEPT Spruce, Tamarack, Cedar, Pine, Oak, Yellow Birch, Hemlock, Aspen and any trees marked in ORANGE paint. Slash must be kept less than or equal to 24" throughout stand.

Pine Thinning (93 Acres): Cut all Aspen, 3 stick or more Balsam fir and any tree marked in BLUE paint. Slash must be kept less than or equal to 24" throughout stand.

In All Harvest Areas: Reserve all standing snags that do not pose a safety risk.

Seasonal Restrictions:

Harvest may occur in dry or frozen ground conditions in all areas EXCEPT:

- The NON-FROZEN GROUND Shelterwood area MUST be harvested in NON FROZEN conditions to allow for soil scarification.
- Within the OPTIONAL CUT Wood Turtle Buffer Area, NO harvest allowed between March 15th and October 31st.
- Within the Osprey Nest Buffer Area, NO harvest allowed between March 15th and August 15th.
 - Buffer Areas will be delineated by DNR Sale Administrator during harvest if cutting adjacent to the buffer areas is to occur during restricted harvest periods.

Additional Requirements:

- All slash must be kept clear of travel ways at all times, and out of wetlands and riparian areas
- Known areas with weed infestation will be flagged by DNR and avoided during operations.
- Sale will be billed using mill ticket system
- No bid bond required, a performance bond of 15% of the total sale bid value will be required. 2 year contract period
- Equipment must be clean of dirt and debris before entering sale area
- Forest plan requires that all native surfaced approaches to paved or graveled roads have 100' of gravel put down when used during non-frozen conditions.
- Safety signs are required on public trails and roads entering active harvest areas.
- All landings and skid trails will be blocked to vehicular access and possibly re-seeded at the conclusion of use if needed
- Slash removal is required within 10' of road edges and along private cutting boundaries
- Biomass harvest allowed in all areas. 10% of topwood will be left on site as biomass harvest guidelines require.

Road and Skid Trails:

- No decking allowed adjacent to FR 670, FR336 or Buffalo Lake Rd. without township permission. Decking locations will be determined at pre-sale meeting.
- All roads utilized, except for FR670, FR670B, FR336 and Buffalo Lake Rd., will be temporary roads and must be restored to pre-sale condition or better and closed by earthen berm or other approved closure method post-harvest.
- Any new temporary roads or turn-arounds will need approval by the timber sale administrator.
- All road maintenance and rehabilitation post-harvest is the purchaser's responsibility. A sample contract including specific road maintenance specifications can be obtained by request. Contact DNR Forester Jim Kujala at the Hayward DNR Service center (715)634-7426 for more information.
