


BLACK RIVER STATE FOREST

Red Pine Thinning - Cut all trees marked with orange. 6 Acres.



Jack/White Pine Harvest - Cut all white and jack pine trees greater than 2" d.b.h. 57 Acres  
 Biomass harvesting allowed in this portion of sale only.

**This is a LUMP SUM sale. Only trees specified for cutting can be cut, and stumpage must be pre-paid by zone. The cutting of additional trees (not designated for this sale) must be pre-authorized by the DNR Forester, piled and paid for separately. Unauthorized cutting will result in fines and/or penalties.**

### Purpose of Sale:

To regenerate jack pine and to thin a small red pine plantation.

### Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:

1. This sale is entirely on high, dry ground, and has no seasonal restrictions.
2. Biomass harvesting may only be done in the jack/white pine harvest area due to poor soil nutrient levels.
3. **This is a LUMP SUM Sale –This sale requires payment prior to beginning harvest operations. Payment for each Zone will be equal to 25% of the total purchase price.** Zones do not have to be cut in sequential order, but each one must be pre-paid before any cutting of trees is allowed in that particular zone.
4. Only trees designated for harvest may be cut. Cutting any additional trees must be pre-authorized by the DNR Forester, then piled separately and paid for as an additional cost.
5. **No hauling on other BRSF scaled sales is allowed while hauling on this job, unless authorized by the DNR Forester.**
6. The sale boundaries are red paint lines, adjoining stands of young trees and Stanton Creek Road. *No cutting of red or yellow painted boundary trees.*
7. Existing landings are marked on the map. Additional landings can be made in the regeneration harvest portion of the sale.
8. One pre-approved skid trail may be made from the east end of Zone 4 through the recent harvest area to the eastern landing marked on the map. Equipment will not be allowed to run through young trees in adjoining stands without DNR approval.
9. Some areas of threatened plants are located within the sale area. These plants will be marked by the DNR prior to harvesting. Operators must take care to avoid these plants with equipment and not pile slash on them.
10. All pine products cut between March 1 and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15.
11. Slash must be evenly lopped/scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Slash within 50 feet of all town roads and recreational trails must lie within 2 feet of the ground. Do not bury seedlings or saplings with slash.

### General Requirements:

1. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
2. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less.
3. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
4. Utilization: cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter. Trees in the Jack/White Pine Harvest Area may be utilized to whole tree if desired.
5. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
6. Any new roads and all landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin.
7. Any berms removed during harvesting operations must be put back to the satisfaction of the DNR Forester.
8. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.
9. Contact the town of Millston prior to beginning logging operations at: 715-284-0913. A free permit is required year-round in order to haul on the roads in this township.
10. **Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Invasive Species applies – contractor must clean equipment before entering and leaving the sale area! This involves brushing away all dirt and cleaning air intakes of debris.**
