

Brule River State Forest Timber Sale Information

Sealed bids will be received at the Brule River State Forest Office, 6250 S. Ranger Rd., Brule, WI 54820, up to 3:00 p.m., Thursday, April 18, 2013 and will be opened immediately thereafter for timber stumpage described in this prospectus. This bid opening will be held for tracts 01-11, 02-11, 03-11, 04-11, 05-11, 10-11, 12-11, 13-11, 15-11, 16-11, 01-12, 03-12, 08-12, 10-12, 15-12, and 17-12 on the Brule River State Forest and tract 02-11 at Pattison State Park. Sealed bids will be accepted by the Brule River State Forest office until 3:00 p.m., Thursday, April 25, 2013 for any tracts not sold on Thursday, April 18, 2013.

1. Bidding Procedure for Timber Sales
 - a. Bids will be made by species for each tract; however, a minimum bid for each species is not published. **Wisconsin DNR Timber Sale Bid Forms must be used to make bids (Found at back of bid package).**
 - b. Estimated volumes used on individual sale prospectus maps are based on a four inch (4") top diameter. Tract 02-11, 03-11, 12-11, and 13-11 (BRSF) and 02-11 (Pattison State Park) will be offered at a less than four inch (4") top diameter utilization, use volumes as listed on individual sale map.
 - c. The **high bidder** will be determined by the **greatest total bid** for each tract.
 - d. Bids will be opened in random order from a draw of the hat.
 - e. **Bidders in attendance** can remove their bid from consideration before each individual tract is opened.
2. Bids may be made on one or more tracts
3. **Submit bids in individual sealed envelopes** marked "Bids for Timber Stumpage" with the tract number and timber sale name on the outside.
4. A per unit bid must be made on every item on a tract.
5. A deposit of fifteen percent (15%) of the total bid must be enclosed with each bid. Bids are understood to be irrevocable offers for a period of 14 days. Submit separate bid bond checks/bonds/letters of credit (LOC) for each tract bid on. **Bid bond checks are subject to verification of sufficient funds with the bidder's bank and deposit into the state forest bank account. Bid bond checks for successful bidders will be deposited in the state forest bank account.** Deposits will be returned to unsuccessful bidders. Successful bidders will forfeit deposit upon failure to sign contract within 14 days of bid opening. **Make all bid bond checks for DNR sales payable to: Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.**
6. A **Performance Bond or Letter of Credit** is required before awarding of contract. The bond shall be fifteen percent (15%) of the total bid value or a **minimum of \$1000.00**. The bond will be held intact by the Department of Natural Resources until the satisfactory completion of the timber sale contract.
7. The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

UTILIZATION

1. All trees designated for cutting will be utilized to a four inch (4") top diameter unless stated otherwise in the prospectus.
2. When designated for cutting, all trees containing one (1) or more one hundred inch (100") long stick to a four inch (4") minimum top diameter will be considered merchantable.

SCALING AND PAYMENT

1. Payment for timber removed from site must be made within 30 days after hauling or scaling under deferred payment option unless otherwise indicated on sale map.

2. The mill scale ticket system will be used as the preferred method of sale administration for sales on the Brule River State Forest. Other scaling systems may be used at the discretion of the Department of Natural Resources.
3. If a woods scale system is used, all cordwood will be piled for scaling. Piles will be level and square with at least two cords per pile. At least 20 cords will be piled before a scale is requested. Scaling requests must be made at least one day in advance.
4. Weight scale conversions will be at rates as specified in the DNR timber sale handbook.

CONTRACT PERIOD

1. The contract period shall be for a period of 2 years unless otherwise noted.
2. Contract extensions will not be granted without justifiable reason. Justification will be determined by the Department of Natural Resources. If extended, stumpage prices will be increased by five percent (5%). For each additional extension, the stumpage rate will be increased by ten percent (10%).

OTHER CONDITIONS

1. Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Water Quality (BMPs) and Woody Biomass Harvesting Guidelines must be followed on all DNR timber sales.

The "Contractor" (purchaser) shall provide the Department with a Certificate of Insurance counter-signed by a Wisconsin Resident Agent, indicating that Worker's Compensation Insurance coverage is provided for the duration of the contract prior to any performance under it. Such Certificate of Insurance shall further include the condition that the insurer shall notify the Department at the Brule River State Forest Office within five (5) days of any change in its terms of twenty (20) days prior to its termination.

Contract may contain other provisions. A sample copy of the contract is available upon request.

Current Brule River State Forest contracts that have run longer than the original expiration date must be completed before sale operations are started on a new contract.

2. Sale is offered as a whole tree harvest. If harvested whole tree leave 1 of every 10 tops on site.
3. Cut and utilize all aspen which contain at least one 100" stick to a 4" top diameter.
4. Cut and utilize all balsam fir which contain at least TWO 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter
5. Leave all spruce, red maple, white pine, and standing dead trees uncut unless they pose a safety issue.
6. Slash must be spread evenly across site to a depth no greater than 3 feet.

1. Sale boundaries marked in red and blue paint. Congdon Road will also act as a boundary.
2. Thinning Area: Cut all red pine and red oak marked in orange. Cut all red maple, ironwood and aspen 2" and larger. Utilize all cut products that contain at least one 100" stick to a 4" top diameter.
3. Clearcut Area: Cut all oak, aspen, jack pine, and fir 4" and larger. Cut all red maple and ironwood 2" and larger. LEAVE ALL WHITE PINE AND RED PINE AND ANY OAK MARKED IN GREEN. Utilize all cut products that contain at least one 100" stick to a 4" top diameter.
4. Leave all standing dead trees uncut unless they pose a safety issue.
5. Slash must be spread evenly across site to a depth no greater than 3 feet.
6. Harvest will be limited to dry or frozen ground.
7. Pine products cut between May and August must be hauled within 2 weeks to prevent bark beetle infestation.
8. New road and/or landing construction must be approved by property manager or contract administrator.

1. Sale boundaries marked in red and blue paint.
2. Harvest Area A: Cut all Oak, Aspen, Maple, Jack Pine, Fir, Spruce, and Birch that contains at least one 100" stick to a 4" top diameter. Dead standing oak may be harvested, but one in every ten must be left on site. LEAVE all red and white pine.
3. Harvest Area B: Cut all Oak, Maple, and Jack Pine at least 2" in diameter, utilize any which contains at least one 100" stick to a 4" top. Cut all Red pine marked in orange and cut all birch NOT marked in green and utilize any which contain at least one 100" stick to a 4" top diameter. LEAVE all Aspen and White pine.
4. Slash must be spread evenly across site to a depth no greater than 3 feet.

1. Sale boundaries are marked in red paint.
2. Harvest Area A: Cut and utilize all red pine, white pine, jack pine and spruce that contain at least one 100" stick to a 4" top. Disregard orange paint. Care must be taken to minimize impact to regeneration.
3. Harvest Area B: Cut and utilize all jack pine and aspen that contains at least one 100" stick to a 4" top.
4. Slash must be spread evenly across site to a depth no greater than 3 feet.
5. All products cut between May 15 and August 15 must be hauled within two weeks to prevent bark beetle infestation.
6. Care will be taken to not impact or damage any old Gordon Nursery structures.
