Trout River Pine

Vilas County

Town 41 North, Range 6 East

Section 21- NENW, NWNE, NENE, SWNE, SENE

15% of the total bid value or \$1,000.00, whichever is greater, will be required for the performance bond.

The cutting area is approximately 24 acres.

The contract period is 2 years.

There are no seasonal restrictions.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to the minimum 4" top diameter will be cut and utilized.

Whole tree utilization is not allowed.

All stems cut that are less than 4" are to be left on site.


¹Red Pine (Co-Mingled) Volumes: 28% Red Pine Pulp Tons (66 Cords)/21 % White Pine Pulp Tons (50 Cords) /44% Red Pine Saw Log Tons or 42 MBF/3% White Pine Small Saw Log Tons or 3 MBF/4% White Pine Large Saw Log Tons or 4MBF

²Mixed Hardwoods: 30% White Birch Pulp Tons (33 Cords) / 20% Red Maple Pulp Tons (22 Cords)/ 50% Aspen Pulp Tons (55 Cords)

Special Conditions

1. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested.
2. Biomass Harvesting is not allowed.
3. Harvest all trees marked with orange paint, plus harvest all aspen, white birch, maple and harvests all balsam fir within this stand. Slash must be lopped and/or scattered to lie within two feet of the ground and pulled back at least ten feet behind the tree line concurrent with cutting. No tops or slash allowed across any red line, blue line, wetland, grass openings or within any county and woods roads.
4. Landings and new road construction must be approved by forester prior to construction.
5. Pit run gravel will be required to maintain operability and repair the soft road bed. Contractor will be responsible to maintain and repair roads. The State Forest will provide the gravel from the Caywood gravel pit.
6. Snow must be kept on snowmobile trails during the winter months (if plowed) and be free of tops and debris.
7. Landings are allowed in game openings.
8. Absolutely no damage or harm to any of the residual trees.
9. Harvest under dry or frozen-ground conditions only.
10. All pine products cut between May 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1 of each year.
