



The objectives for this part of the Forest are to increase the presence and age of red pine and white pine in all timber types. Additionally, the aspen component is to be maintained as a dominant community on the landscape.

The Aspen type will be regenerated through harvesting most of the trees. This cut will mimic a natural disturbance and allow the early successional aspen type to be maintained on the landscape. Another goal of this harvest will be to increase the age class diversity of the aspen type in the vicinity. The year of origin for the aspen type is 1967.

The RED PINE areas are composed of overstocked red pine plantations. Within this pine type the majority of the shorter-lived species will be harvested along with approximately one-third of the pine trees. This technique will help to maintain the growth and vigor of the stand. The year of origin for the pine plantations is 1966.

The LOWLAND SPRUCE MIX is composed of swamp conifer species. Strip clearcuts will be used to regenerate roughly one-third of the area indicated. The year of origin for the spruce type is 1904.

Seasonal restrictions related to oak wilt will likely be implemented in part of the ASPEN MIX. Biomass harvesting will not be allowed due to nutrient poor soils.
