The cutting area is approximately 142 acres.

The contract period is 3 years.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to a 4" top diameter will be cut and utilized.

¹ Approximately 88% balsam fir, 12% white pine. Includes 4 MBF white pine sawtimber. (Wt. conv. 2.122 tons/cord)

² Approximately 48% red maple, 28% hard maple, 23% white birch, 1% basswood. (Wt. conv. 2.371 tons/cord)


³ Approximately 88% red oak, 6% white birch, 2% hard maple, 2% red maple, and 2% basswood.

Note: Total sale volume equates to 44.7 tons/acre or 18.8 cords/acre.

Special Conditions:

- 1. Harvest operations are only allowed from July 15 to December 1 to prevent oak wilt and to minimize impacts to the groomed ski trails. All hauling must be completed by December 15. Snowfall amounts may result in more or less flexibility on these dates as determined by the DNR Forester. Daylight only working hours to minimize disturbance to the surrounding campsites.**
2. Cutting must be concurrent for all species including non-merchantable trees where designated.
3. Do not cut, knock down or utilize any dead trees.
- 4. Short-wood forwarding only within the entire sale and take extreme care to not damage pine saplings.**
5. Slash must be lopped and/or scattered to lie within two feet of the ground and be pulled back 10' behind the tree line along all roads and trails concurrently with cutting.
6. Whole tree utilization or biomass harvesting is not allowed.
7. All pine products cut between May 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1 of each year.
- 8. Skid trails crossing Escanaba trail must be kept to a minimum. Contractor must fix any logging damage to the trail immediately upon discontinued use of a skid trail. Escanaba trail must remain free of slash and other logging debris and kept in good shape at all times.**
9. The blacktop road to the Escanaba boat landing/DNR fisheries station cannot be used for hauling or skidding.
10. The approximate location of a proposed new haul road is shown on the timber sale map. Costs and construction of this new road should be taken into account by the successful bidder.

Harvest operations are only allowed from July 15 to Dec. 1. All hauling must be completed by Dec. 15. Daylight only working hours.
