


Seasonal Movement Adult Male White-tailed Deer

This map displays radio telemetry locations from April through November of 2011 for deer #3. This particular deer was captured in Sawyer County, Wisconsin as an adult male on January 19, 2011, and moved 2-3 miles southeast at the end of April. He was harvested during the late archery season on December 13, 2011. Similar late fall and early spring movements appear to be common seasonal migration patterns for white-tailed deer in the northern forest region of Wisconsin. Movements such as these are likely the result of different nutritional and cover requirements between the winter and summer in the northern forest. In this particular case, there are more food sources closer to the lake in the northwest corner of the map due to backyard feeding of deer during the winter. Although no telemetry locations were estimated for this deer after December 6, it is possible he was transitioning between his summer range in the southeast corner of the map to a winter range towards the northwest corner. Perhaps as a result of this movement he increased his chance of encountering a hunter, and thus was harvested.
