




**WISCONSIN DNR
FISHERIES INFORMATION SHEET
LONG LAKE, IRON COUNTY, 2015**


The WDNR conducted a fisheries assessment of Long Lake, Iron County, from April 15, 2015 to April 18, 2015. Long Lake is a 396 acre drainage lake with a maximum depth of 30 feet. The adult walleye population in Long Lake was estimated to be 396 fish or 1 fish per acre.

Other Species

Some other species observed during this survey but not included in the report were black crappie, bluegill, brown and yellow bullheads, largemouth bass, pumpkinseed, rock bass, and yellow perch.

We are also conducting a creel (angler harvest) survey on Long Lake this year. Creel clerk Chuck Janov will count and interview anglers and examine their catch throughout the fishing season.

General Fishing Regulations for Long Lake, Iron County, 2015

FISH SPECIES	OPEN SEASON	DAILY LIMIT	MINIMUM LENGTH
Walleye	May 02-March 06	3	15" MINIMUM, 20-24" PROTECTED, 1>24"
Largemouth Bass	May 02-March 06	5*	14" MINIMUM
Smallmouth Bass	June 20-March 06	5*	14" MINIMUM
Muskellunge	May 23-November 30	1	40" MINIMUM
Northern Pike	May 02-March 06	5	NO MINIMUM

*During harvest season for each species; you are allowed a daily bag limit of five largemouth or smallmouth bass in total.

This report is interim only; data and findings should not be considered final. Results of creel surveys should be available by June of the year following the survey.
