

GameReg – How do I report my harvest?

Registration of all deer, bear, turkey, sharp-tailed grouse, geese, bobcat, fisher and otter remains mandatory in Wisconsin! It is not an option.

Immediately upon killing a deer, validate this tag by writing the date of kill and circling AM or PM. You may not leave the carcass unless this tag is attached to it. This tag must remain intact and legible. Consider protecting with a plastic bag.

Registration is required by 6:00 pm the day after recovery at GameReg.WI.Gov or 844-GAMEREG (844-426-3734). You must write the confirmation number on this tag. Retain this tag until meat is consumed.

For season dates, weapon restrictions, and regulations, view the applicable regulation pamphlet- available online at GoWild.WI.Gov.

TAG NUMBER: You will need the TAG NUMBER from your carcass tag to begin the harvest registration process. Enter the correct zone, county/Deer Management Unit/Game Management Unit, and land type (deer only—public or private) during registration. *If you do not have a tag number, call the DNR at 1-888-936-7463 for assistance.*

WRITE CONFIRMATION NUMBER: The 10-character **must be legibly written** on the tag or goose harvest card as proof of registration. The carcass tag with confirmation number written on it must be retained by the hunter until the meat is consumed.

When registering by phone, enter the correct three-digit county code when prompted by using your phone keypad to spell the first three letters of the county of kill (i.e. 232 for Adams).

In Person (deer and bear only): Participating registration stations will be listed on the department website, dnr.wi.gov. Use the key words, "Game registration" to search.

Bobcat, fisher and otter: Report within 24 hours AND contact a warden to register your harvest within 5 days of the end of the month of harvest

When am I required to carry my paper license, tag, harvest card, safety education certificate and recreational vehicle temporary operating receipt? And when are alternative forms of proof of purchase valid?
