Joint Letter Supporting Cleanup and Restoration of the Badger Army Ammunition Plant lands

August 29, 2013

We, the undersigned, urge the U.S. Department of Defense, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, National Park Service and our State and Congressional leaders to secure the highest degree of environmental cleanup to assure the conservation of the former Badger lands for ecological restoration, education, sustainable agriculture, and low-impact recreation.

Successful ecological restoration of the Badger lands relies on the restoration of once healthy soils and water. Too often these decisions disregard the impact of time and of accumulating effects to future generations. This shortsighted approach provides no accountability or commitment to steward lands and water resources now and for the future. The focus tends to be on defining how much pollution or how little cleanup is acceptable, rather than striving for what is truly desirable and achievable.

These fundamental values are the basis of the Badger Reuse Plan which has been formally supported by local, state, federal and tribal governments, area business interests, farmers, landowners and environmental organizations.

Comments from Individuals:

"The area needs (the) highest level of environmental cleanup from all non-natural substances including the ground water systems. A report must identify all reasons where 100% cleanup was not obtained. Best technologies should be described as well as any suggestion to improve them through research."

"No ATV's - No Shooting Range."

"It is time to do the right thing! For our grandchildren's children."

"Let the land rest in peace for prairie restoration & for grassland birds, small mammals, & other species for all people to enjoy. To let ATV's in would be a travesty. Please keep Badger land pristine as can be."

"Adhere to a plan of low-impact recreational use. No ATVs, snowmobiles or a rifle range."

"Ecological Restoration of Badger is our primary concern."

"Some of the ancient tribal lands should be returned to them. If the University & others get some Tribal right to ownership must be given! Keep on demanding proper cleanup! It is only fair for the use of all that acreage!"

"Government at all levels seems to have the worst track record regarding clean up of polluted land, water, and air. I urge all Federal and State departments involved to do the "right thing," restore Badger to the highest degree possible, not the cheapest. No ATV's + No rifle range - not compatible with other uses."

"It is imperative that this plan be adopted and implemented!"

"Any stopping of clean-up or high impact recreation is contrary to any ecological restoration which is so vital."

"No ATVs! No shooting range! Keep large tracts in grass & shrubs to help birds. Do not allow grazing on this still polluted land. Clean it up!"

"We are very concerned about exposing the public to the extensive toxins that are still in the ground, soils & ground water at and around the Badger plant. The cleanup should be ongoing until the time it is deemed to be healthy. A Health assessment by the WI Dept. of Health had concerns about Badger as recently as 5/16/13."

"You have an opportunity to make difference & to save a jewel in our State. Please do so..."

"I see this effort to preserve and protect Badger equivalent to the legacy of the state and national parks passed on to us by previous generations. Let's do this, and do it right."

"These lands are needed as wildlife refuge for all species, flowers, plants & animals. Should not be opened to any motorized vehicles."

"Not ATVs, No Shooting Range!!!"

"Thank you for (CSWAB's) tireless work on behalf of the wildlife & people of the Badger area & the state of WI, to bring this plan to fruition & to protect Badger from further dangerous & polluting encroachment. Your dedication to the work has always been exemplary."

"Doing what is right is not always easy. Let's make sure we do it right."

"Low-impact recreation is the only way natural resources can be preserved while humans use them. Those are the key words."

"I want the Ho-Chunk Nation go get some of the land. After all they were here way before us, & a good clean-up of the land before anything else."

"During my 10 yrs. employment with both shop carpenters and union carpenters, I have seen the toxic waste, pollution, asbestos in bldgs. Best is clean up, no more pollution ATVs."

"These special lands must be guarded in the best environmental ways to become the best fitted for future use in the most desirable ways."

"I fully support the above comments with its important goals."

"Option #4 should be the #1 Choice!"

"Please do not leave the job undone. This is unacceptable."

"U.S. Army ++ other Gov. agencies – MUST continue to restore this entire area to what it was before the Long WAR effort. Water – land – and natural environment – what a beautiful place to "rehab" and protect and restore!!!! A must – despite how long it takes!!"

"Please clean up the Badger lands that have been made less whole by actions of the government and corporations."

"We also strongly oppose the use of any part of this resource for a shooting range or off-road vehicle use – another DNR travesty."

We, the undersigned, fully support the consensus vision for the Badger property as expressed in the Badger Reuse Plan. This vision is clearly reiterated in the land transfer agreement between the U.S. National Park Service and the WDNR, and explicitly limits future uses and management of the Badger property for conservation, restoration, ecological research, education, sustainable agriculture and LOW-IMPACT recreation.

We demand that the Wisconsin DNR and the Natural Resources Board faithfully adhere to the values and recommendations of the Badger Reuse Plan and to the terms of its 2005 agreement with the National Park Service, ensuring a conservation future for the Sauk Prairie on the Badger lands.



[REDACTED]	[REDACTED]	2013-03-19	<p>Stay the course and adhere to the Badger Reuse Plan which was forged under the auspices of a multitude of stakeholders with shared communal interest in the Sauk Prairie and the larger landscape. ATVs and other vehicular traffic will only aggravate the damage to the ecosystem from invasive species, including, but not limited to reed canary grass, sweet clover, wild parsnip and Queen Anne's Lace, and bull thistle and burdock, as well as Dame's Rocket, to name but a few. Model rocketry is also exceedingly inappropriate for such a fire prone landscape as a native prairie can be. I've worked many thousands of hours at a summer camp for boys up in Sawyer County, where the rains are continual up until late June. And still, we had several months where we needed to be very cognizant of the fact that 1 misguided, wind blown rocket launch careening in the wrong direction could not only endanger the children many hundreds of yards away, but was quite capable of igniting wildfires in the tall dry grass in the area. The Sauk Prairie is >300-fold larger in area than the rocket staging area with many times greater dried biomass of readily combustible fuel. Add overly enthusiastic rocketeers and red hot exhaust gasses careening out of control in excess of 200 mph in all possible directions due to consistently unpredictable wind shear, and you've got a fire hazard of incredible proportions. Let's not go there, there is a place and a time for most everything, but this area is most definitely not appropriate for model rocketry, no matter what the safeguards put in place. All you need is one out of control wildfire and people being put in imminent danger, due to a carelessly launched rocket, and the repercussions will reverberate across the landscape for generations. And as for high-powered rifle ranges, aren't there enough of those in this part of the state already? Can't there be anyplace where true lovers of peaceful scenery and native flora and faunas in a restored WI landscape similar to thousands of years ago, can go to wander and lose themselves to nature's calming embrace, without constantly being reminded of the cacophony of guns and their piercing reports cutting through the bucolic rolling hills clad in all their magnificent hues of blue, green, and royal purples? Perhaps peace and quiet, and sacred sanctuaries for the soul are lost on some of us, but can't this one last refuge be preserved, restored, and appreciated, as it once was, aeons ago, in tranquility, without rifle-fire, except of course, for regulated hunts during appropriate seasons, as is currently enforced elsewhere in the state.</p>

- 2013-03-20 Having an area this large to restore as a natural area is a RARE opportunity which should not be lost.
- 2013-03-20 I have had the privilege of volunteer managing over 200 acres of the former Mare Island Naval Ammunition Depot in Vallejo, CA for the past 6 years. The more than 500 acres of our ammo depot served our country from 1857 to 1975 and like Badger, is included in our Reuse Plan approved by our City Council in 1994 for natural resource protection and restoration, environmental education and a wide range of passive public enjoyment. The natural lands that had been virtually extinguished necessary for safe storage of munitions, has returned in an exciting and important way to the ancient island. For example beginning in 2001 with one pair of osprey nesting on an abandoned light pole on a pier, we are the proud hosts to as many as 15 pairs of nesting osprey today. More than 1,000 people a month come to the former ammo depot to hike, bike, picnic, view the surrounding 7 counties from our hilltop vantage point and explore the natural and historic mix of ever evolving "return of the natives!" We call it our island's "second nature". Our Reuse Plan later refined as the Regional Park Taskforce Report and a yet to be completed Master Plan, all recognize that passive recreation is the only appropriate recreation in this fragile land so long managed for munitions manufacturing, storage and transport. I urge Wisconsin DNR to set the standard by which the literally hundreds of other former ammo depots throughout the nation, can be returned to their former natural state, and/or complementary passive recreational uses including environmental education and other compatible uses such as agriculture. Since being inspired by Greenfire, the movie about Aldo Leopold, I have reviewed Badger's plans and feel strongly that the current Badger Reuse Plan is the direction that makes the only really good sense in charting a course for its future.
