


# Exceptional and Outstanding Resource Waters and 303(d) Degraded Waters (2010 Update)

Outstanding Resource Water (ORW) is defined as a lake or stream which has excellent water quality, high recreational and aesthetic value, and high quality fishing and is free from point source and nonpoint source pollution (see sec. NR 102.11, Wis. Adm. Code).
