Chippewa Moraine offers the following naturalist-guided programs correlated to Wisconsin Model Academic Standards:

## Covered By Ice

Learn about the causes and formations of the last continental glacier that entered Wisconsin and the glacier's natural and cultural effects. Children will enthusiastically search for answers to questions by using a variety of hands-on displays in the Interpretive Center.

## Historical Activities

The fur trade and logging industry in Wisconsin were very successful. Those early settlers worked hard but played just as hard. Students will compete against their classmates in throwing tomahawks, cutting wood with two-person crosscut saws, and pulling their competitors off of short stumps. Each class winner then competes against the other class winners.

## Reptile Roundup

Find out if snakes are really "slimy" by holding one or cradle a baby snapping turtle in your hand. Watch a snake eat a meal. We will discuss how a snake uses its senses and conduct a brief experiment to test the snake's hearing.
