Friday May 30 Morning at Weborg Point 8 – 9 AM Park at Weborg day use lot. Meet at Weborg Shelter Building. Birds & flowers featured.

Saturday May 31 Bird Feeder Bonanza Drop by the Nature Center anytime between 10 AM and 12 Noon to craft a bird feeder from recycled materials (while supplies last). Decorate your feeder. Learn about Peninsula birds, too. Plan on 30 minutes to complete this activity. **Eagle Trail Hike** 1 – 3 PM. Meet at Eagle Tower. Hike along spectacular bluffs to see shallow sea caves, wildflowers and trees. Discover park geology, too. Two miles. Difficult.

Monday June 2 Skyline Trail Hike 1 – 2:30 PM. Meet at Skyline Parking lot on Shore Road. Stroll to the top of a stunning overlook. Tree identification, park history featured. About two miles. Moderate hiking.

Tuesday June 3 Peninsula Trivia Challenge! How well do you know Peninsula State Park? Stop by the Nature Center any time during open hours to take a 10-minute quiz. Free park bookmark for trying.

Friday June 6 Rowdy Raccoons 10 – 10:30 AM Nature Center. Discover how the “masked bandit” survives through story and finger plays. Learn what you can do at your campsite to discourage this night time visitor. See raccoon fur, skulls and tracks, too. Optional kids craft.
